3 **Resolution Authorizing Environment Department Funding Recommendation for**
4 **Zero Waste Grant Award During the Fiscal Year 2023-2026 Grant Cycles.**

6 WHEREAS, San Francisco Environment Department (“the Department”)
7 provides grant funding to nonprofit organizations to further the City and County of
8 San Francisco’s climate and zero waste goals through robust community
9 engagement; and

10 WHEREAS, On September 15, 2023, the Department released a request for
11 proposals to provide opportunities for bicycle repair at Department-coordinated
12 “fix-it” clinics. Along with similar neighborhood-scale initiatives promoting repair
13 of clothing, equipment, electronics, and other goods, these community events will
14 offer free and accessible bike repair options to residents at public libraries, schools,
15 and public spaces throughout the City. With a strong focus on under-resourced
16 neighborhoods, these clinics will reduce bike disposal, slow the purchase of new
17 bikes, and increase bicycle ridership in San Francisco. In addition, these events
18 will support the goals of San Francisco’s 2021 Climate Action Plan, including
19 reduction of municipal solid waste generation by 15% and disposal to landfill and
20 incineration by 50% by 2030 from 2015 levels; and

21 WHEREAS, The Commission on the Environment approved amendments to
22 Resolution File No. 2022-08-COE on December 6, 2022, requiring the
23 Environment Department to receive Commission on the Environment approval
24 before executing any new outgoing grant requiring anticipated expenditures by the
25 Department of \$100,000 or more, or executing any amendment on an existing
26 outgoing grant that will cumulatively increase anticipated expenditures by 50
27 percent or more and has an amended total of \$100,000 or more; now, therefore, be
28 it

1 RESOLVED, That the Commission on the Environment approves the award
2 of one grant totaling \$59,716 to be disbursed during fiscal years 2023-2026 to the
3 following organization:
