3 **Resolution Authorizing Environment Department Funding Recommendations**  
4 **for Grants Awards to Three Organizations During the Fiscal Year 2022-2023**  
5 **Grant Cycle.**

7 WHEREAS, The Environment Department (“Department”) provides grant  
8 funding to nonprofit groups to further the City’s climate goals through robust  
9 community engagement; and

10 WHEREAS, On January 3, 2023, the Department released a request for  
11 proposals to develop and operate the San Francisco Climate Equity Hub. This  
12 grant-funded project will advance climate justice by developing a clearinghouse  
13 that will provide support to homeowners, renters, and workers to help them  
14 transition to all-electric buildings. In addition, this project will expand the work of  
15 the Zero Emission Buildings Task Force, a commitment made in the Building  
16 Operations section of the 2021 Climate Action Plan; and

17 WHEREAS, On March 2, 2023, the Department released a request for  
18 proposals for electric vehicle (“EV”) charging plaza community outreach. This  
19 grant-funded project will help develop and install three EV fast-charging plazas,  
20 fund a new electric-bike food delivery pilot program, build on the City’s efforts to  
21 make climate and EV programs equitable and accessible for all residents, and  
22 support the development of a robust EV mapping tool. In addition, this project will  
23 help San Francisco reduce air pollution and greenhouse gas emissions and advance  
24 its EV Roadmap and Climate Action Plan; and

25 WHEREAS, The Commission on the Environment approved amendments to  
26 Resolution File No. 2022-08-COE on December 6, 2022, requiring the  
27 Environment Department to receive Commission on the Environment approval  
28 before executing any new outgoing grant requiring anticipated expenditures by the

1 Department of \$100,000 or more, or executing any amendment on an existing  
 2 outgoing grant that will cumulatively increase anticipated expenditures by 50  
 3 percent or more and has an amended total of \$100,000 or more; now, therefore, be  
 4 it

5 RESOLVED, That the Commission on the Environment approves the award  
 6 of grants, totaling \$450,000 to be disbursed during fiscal year 2022-2023 to the  
 7 following organizations:
