## Urging Board of Supervisors to Enact Bicycle Plan

Resolution No. 028-97-COE - October 14, 1997

WHEREAS, the use of automobiles is a primary factor in Bay Area air pollution, and both the City's Transit First policy and its Sustainability Plan urge the reduction of automobile use; and

WHEREAS, the increased use of bicycles by commuters and others will help accomplish the goal of reduced auto use; and

WHEREAS, the conditions of most San Francisco streets are not favorable to safe use by law-abiding cyclists, nor are there many safe locations to park or store bicycles in primary enterprise zones; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Commission on the Environment urges the Board of Supervisors to enact in a timely fashion the recommendations contained in the Bicycle Plan developed by the Department of Parking and Traffic.
