

(Treasure Island Sustainability)

URGING SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT ON TREASURE ISLAND

WHEREAS, the former Naval Station Treasure Island, consisting of Treasure Island and a portion of Yerba Buena Island, is soon to be conveyed to the City and County of San Francisco; and,

WHEREAS, the redevelopment of Treasure Island/Yerba Buena Island presents an unparalleled opportunity to implement the goals and objectives of "The Sustainability Plan for the City of San Francisco"; and,

WHEREAS, the "Naval Treasure Island Draft Reuse Plan" will be used as a guide that identifies certain goals and objectives for the redevelopment of Treasure Island and incorporates some of the concepts addressed in the "Sustainability Plan for the City of San Francisco"; and,

WHEREAS, the Commission on the Environment and the Department of the Environment have established programs and priorities in the areas of Resource Efficient Building, Clean Air, Integrated Pest Management, and Public Education and Outreach; and,

WHEREAS, the Commission on the Environment and the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco adopted resolutions supporting the creation of wetlands on Treasure Island in order to mitigate and control wastewater entering the Bay; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Commission on the Environment urges the Treasure Island Development Authority to work with the Department of the Environment to develop the Evaluation Criteria and Scoring System for the Request For Proposals (RFP) for the primary developer; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Commission on the Environment urges the Treasure Island Development Authority to integrate specific environmental topics including, but not limited to, air quality, water quality, biodiversity, renewable energy, and resource conservation into the Request for Proposals, the Redevelopment Plan, and any other guiding or binding documents; and to actively encourage the implementation of the Resource-Efficient Buildings Ordinance, the Integrated Pest Management Program and the Clean Air Program.
